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Advisory Business

Steerson Advisors LLC, is organized under the laws of the State of Florida since March 3, 2023. We are 100% owned by Rafael Dov Cuchacovich Francos. We filed our application to register as an investment adviser with the State of Florida, and other states as necessary, in order to provide the investment advisory services described within this document. As of June 17, 2026, we currently have a total of \$3,457,648 in assets under management.

This Disclosure Brochure provides you with information regarding our qualifications, business practices, and the nature of advisory services that should be considered before becoming our advisory client. Qualified individuals associated with us will provide our investment advisory services. Such individuals are known as Investment Advisor Representatives ("IARs"). We require IARs engaged in determining or offering investment advice to our clients to be properly licensed and registered in all states in which they provide investment advisory services.

Below is a description of the investment advisory services we offer. For more detail on any product or service please reference your Client Investment Advisory Agreement ("IAA") or contact your IAR.

Advisory Services

We provide discretionary investment management to high-net-worth families and individuals.

We aim to serve our clients through the design, construction, and management of specialized investment portfolios to achieve either capital preservation or long-term capital growth.

Although we offer portfolio management services for all associated clients, we treat each client account distinctly according to personal preferences, investment guidelines and long-term investment objectives.

During your initial consultation(s), your IAR will have a comprehensive discussion about your financial condition, priorities and concerns. Based upon these conversations, we will then work to create either a formal investment policy statement or informal agreed upon investment objectives to serve as the primary point of reference and ensure that your objectives are clearly defined. We also review your financial situation and needs with you on an ongoing basis, accommodating for any changes related to your long-term goals and objectives.

Our compensation structure is based on a combination of both a percentage of assets under management and a performance-based fee subject to high-water mark. It is possible for clients to request alternative fee structures, however, this will be subject to revision and evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

Investment Philosophy

Our investment philosophy focuses on the idea that at times markets may present inconsistencies between the current price of a security and its long-term value. We believe these anomalies can be identified and evaluated through rigorous research and analysis across different markets, sectors, and asset classes. However, regardless of the depth of our research or the risk management techniques implemented, we still have no guarantees that such inefficiencies are present or that timely convergence between price and value will eventually materialize. Therefore, we approach investing as inherently probability-driven, managing portfolios with the understanding that although many external variables are beyond our control, making disciplined investment decisions while enforcing strict risk management procedures always is.

We invest primarily in exchange-traded securities with a focus on either capital preservation or capital growth.

It is also possible for clients to impose reasonable investment restrictions on certain securities, industries, sectors, markets or asset classes by providing us with written instructions when you decide to acquire our services, or at any time thereafter. Please note, such restrictions and personal investment preferences may affect the composition and performance of your portfolio. For these reasons, performance of the portfolio may not be identical to that of other clients.

Wrap Fee Programs

We do not offer wrap-fee services at this time.

Fees and Compensation

The compensation structure for our services will vary according to the strategy implemented. We offer two core strategies:

- I. **Capital Preservation:** Features a flat annualized Management Fee of 0.6% of assets under management, calculated and billed monthly, based on the portfolio's end-of-month value and with no performance-based components attached.
- II. **Capital Growth:** This model features an annualized Management Fee of 0.2% in addition to a 15% Performance Fee on Net New Appreciation, subject to a perpetual High-Water Mark. Both components are calculated and billed monthly, based on the portfolio's end-of-month value.

Alternative fee structures may be arranged to accommodate specific client preferences, however, always subject to review.

Payment of Fees

Client fees are automatically calculated and deducted from the account. The Client will receive a direct invoice. No fees shall be paid in advance. The calculation and deduction of fees are automatically performed by the account broker-dealer and custodian. We do not have authority to access client accounts or any of their funds, beyond our limited trading authority to execute transactions on behalf of the account holder.

Other Fees

Our fees do not include brokerage commissions, transaction fees, and other brokerage related costs and expenses that are paid by you. You may pay additional fees imposed by custodians, brokers, and other third parties. The advisory fee does not cover charges imposed by third parties for investments held in the account, such as contingent deferred sales charges or 12b-1 trails on exchange-traded funds. In addition, each exchange-traded funds and exchange traded funds charge asset management fees, which are in addition to our advisory fees. These fees may include, but are not limited to, a management fee, upfront sales charges, and other fund expenses. The advisory fee described above does not cover debit balances or related margin interest or SEC fees or other fees or taxes required by law. The fees charged by such funds or managers are disclosed in each fund's prospectus. You should review the fund's prospectus for a complete description of all fees and expenses.

All of these other fees are exclusive of, and in addition to, our compensation. We do not offset our fees by these charges.

Termination of Contract

Client, upon written notice, shall have the right to terminate the agreement and service at any time. Charges in either case, if any, for services completed will be determined as set forth in the Investment Advisory Agreement. No other termination fee will be charged for termination of the service.

Detailed information on the termination terms and fees can be found in the applicable Investment Advisory Agreement.

Performance-Based Fees and Side-By-Side Management

One of our core strategies, specifically the “Capital Growth” model, features a material performance-based fee component. This implies that prospective clients must meet the minimum requirements established by their respective local financial regulatory agencies before accessing this service.

While alternative fee models are available for services that remove the performance-based component, such as the “Capital Preservation” model, all prospective clients remain subject to compliance with local regulatory and onboarding requirements before accessing any of our services.

Types of Clients

We only provide services to high-net-worth families and individuals. We do not offer services to retail clients or investors who do not fall under the definition of 'Qualified Clients' or 'Accredited Investors' pursuant to local regulatory definitions and requirements.

Methods of Analysis, Investment Strategies and Risk of Loss

Investment Criteria and Sources of Information

Our investment criteria and strategy will depend on whether a portfolio is designed for capital growth or capital preservation. For capital growth portfolios, we aim to select securities that we believe offer exceptional long-term value relative to current market prices. For capital preservation portfolios, we select assets that contribute to broad diversification and provide strong income-generating capabilities, while displaying excellent price stability relative to their peers. We employ fundamental analysis—encompassing both quantitative and qualitative metrics as well as macro and microeconomic factors—across all our investment reviews. For pooled investment vehicles, such as Exchange-Traded Funds (ETFs), we conduct additional diligence regarding ongoing expenses, portfolio liquidity, and underlying fund issuer solvency, among others. Our primary sources of information include financial research tools, publicly available data, government agency publications, and official company financial releases.

We mostly utilize fundamental analysis to evaluate and select our investments, thoroughly reviewing a security's overall financial health, management team, competitive advantages, market dynamics, and any ongoing fees when applicable. This comprehensive review allows us to determine if a security offers attractive valuation measures and whether it aligns with the portfolio's specific needs and objectives. When making investment decisions, we carefully consider the current stages of the relevant markets and securities, as well as the potential implications of substantial macroeconomic and sector-specific changes on asset valuations.

Investment Strategies (Ongoing Management)

We offer two investment strategies according to their respective investment objectives.

- I. Capital Preservation: We focus on assets that offer broad diversification and provide steady income-generating capabilities while prioritizing higher price stability.
- II. Capital Growth: We select securities that we believe offer exceptional long-term value relative to current market prices.

In determining which strategy best fits your investment profile, we will first gather and consider information regarding several factors, including your:

- current financial situation,
- investment goals and objectives,
- current and long-term needs,
- tolerance and appetite for risk, and
- level of investment knowledge.

After developing a thorough understanding of your goals, risk tolerance, and time horizon, we will work together to define a strategy or combination thereof that best fits your long-term investment objectives.

You have the opportunity to place reasonable restrictions or constraints on the types of recommendations issued to your account. However, such restrictions may affect the composition and performance of your portfolio. For these reasons, performance of the recommended portfolio may not be identical to other clients of ours.

We invest primarily in equities and Exchange-Traded Funds (ETFs); however, when appropriate, we may also allocate capital to specific mutual funds. The selection and use of these investment alternatives will depend on the chosen investment strategy, as well as possible legal considerations regarding the relevant jurisdictions in which the client resides or originates. We might perform adjustments to your portfolio as required to control risk, take profits or acquire new positions, and reduce or eliminate positions due to relative overpricing or lack of performance, to replace them for better regarded alternatives, or to capture profits.

Risk of Loss, Disclosures and other important information

There are inherent risks involved for each investment strategy or method of analysis we use and the particular type of security we might purchase. Investing in securities involves risk of loss which you should be prepared to bear. Depending on the types of securities we invest in, you may face the following investment risks:

Market Risk: The price of a security may drop in reaction to tangible and intangible events and conditions. This type of risk is caused by external factors independent of a security's particular underlying circumstances. For example, political, economic and social conditions may trigger market events.

Business Risk: These risks are associated with a specific industry or a specific company within an industry. For example, early-stage oil drilling companies depend on finding oil and then refining it, a lengthy process, before they can generate a profit. They carry a higher risk of profitability than an electric company, which generates its income from a steady stream of customers who buy electricity no matter what the economic environment is like.

Inflation Risk: When any type of inflation is present, a dollar today will not buy as much as a dollar next year, because purchasing power is eroding at the rate of inflation.

Financial Risk: Excessive borrowing to finance a business' operations increases the risk of profitability, because the company must meet the terms of its obligations in good times and bad. During periods of financial stress, the inability to meet loan obligations may result in bankruptcy and/or a declining market value.

Exchange-Traded Funds Risk: Exchange-traded funds are subject to ongoing and other expenses, which will be indirectly paid by clients. As a result, the cost of our investment strategies will be higher than the cost of investing directly in individual securities, as there are two levels of fees. Exchange-traded funds are subject to specific risks, depending on the nature of the fund.

Growth Style Risks: Due to their relatively high valuations, growth stocks are typically more volatile than value stocks. Further, growth stocks may not pay dividends or may pay lower dividends than value stocks. This means they depend more on price changes for returns and may be more adversely affected in a down market compared to value stocks that pay higher dividends.

Value Style Risks: Investments in value stocks are subject to the risk that their intrinsic values may never be realized by the market, that a stock judged to be undervalued may actually be appropriately priced, or that their prices may decline, even though in theory they are already undervalued. Value stocks can react differently to issuer, political, market and economic developments than the market as a whole and other types of stocks (e.g., growth stocks).

Company Size Risks: Generally, the smaller the market capitalization of a company, the fewer the number of shares traded daily, the less liquid its stock and the more volatile its price. Companies with smaller market capitalizations may also have unproven track records. These factors also increase risks and make these companies more likely to fail than companies with larger market capitalizations or asset base.

Foreign Investing Risks: Investments in foreign companies and markets carry a number of economic, financial and political considerations that could unfavorably affect account performance. Among those risks may be greater price volatility; weak supervision and regulation of securities exchanges, brokers and issuers; higher brokerage costs; fluctuations in foreign currency exchange rates and related conversion costs; adverse tax consequences; and settlement delays.

Fixed Income Securities: Client accounts with all or a portion of the underlying assets invested in fixed income securities and/or fixed-income based exchange-traded funds are subject to the following risks:

- **Interest Rate Risks:** Prices of fixed income securities rise and fall in response to changes in the interest rate paid by similar securities. Generally, when interest rates rise, prices of fixed income securities fall. Interest rate changes have a greater effect on the price of fixed income securities with longer maturities.
- **Credit Risks:** Credit risk is the possibility that an issuer or counterparty will default on a security or repurchase agreement by failing to pay interest or principal when due. If an issuer defaults the value of a fixed income security may decrease and a fund holding securities of that issuer may lose money. Lower credit ratings tend to correspond to higher credit risk. Bonds rated BBB or Baa may have speculative characteristics.
- **Call Risks:** If the fixed income securities in which a fund invests are redeemed by the issuer before maturity (or "called"), the fund may have to reinvest the proceeds in securities that pay a lower interest rate, which may decrease the portfolio's overall yield. This will most likely happen when interest rates are declining.
- **Liquidity Risks:** Liquidity risk refers to the possibility that an investor may not be able to sell or buy a security or close out an investment contract at a favorable price or time. Consequently, an investor, including a fund invested in fixed income securities, may have to accept a lower price to sell a security, sell other securities to raise cash or give up an investment opportunity, any of which could have a negative effect on investment performance. Infrequent trading of securities also may lead to an increase in their price volatility.

Government Obligations Risks: No assurance can be given that governments will provide financial support to government-sponsored agencies or instrumentalities where it is not obligated to do so by law. As a result, there is risk that these entities will default on a financial obligation.

High-Yield Securities Risks: High-yield securities tend to be more sensitive to economic conditions than are higher-rated securities and generally involve more credit risk than securities in the higher-rated categories. The risk of loss due to default by an issuer of high-yield securities may be greater than issuers of higher-rated securities because such securities are generally unsecured and are often subordinated to other creditors. A fund may have difficulty disposing of certain high-yield securities because there may be a thin trading market for such securities.

The above list of risk factors does not purport to be a complete list or explanation of the risks involved in an investment strategy. There are many other circumstances not described here that could adversely affect your investment and prevent you from your investment objectives. The list represents the typical risks involved. The explanation of certain risks is not exhaustive, but rather highlights some of the more significant risks involved in our investment strategies. You are encouraged to consult your IAR and tax professional on an initial and continuous basis in connection with selecting and engaging in the services provided by us. In addition, due to the dynamic nature of investments and markets, strategies may be subject to additional and different risk factors not discussed above.

Disciplinary Information

We are required to disclose all material facts regarding any legal or disciplinary events. We do not have any events to report that are material to a client's or prospective client's evaluation of our advisory business or the integrity of our management.

Other Financial Industry Activities and Affiliations

We are not, nor are any of our management persons (except as disclosed below), registered, nor do we

have an application pending to register as a futures commission merchant, commodity pool operator, commodity trading advisor or as an associated person of the foregoing entities.

In addition, neither we nor any of our management persons have any arrangement that is material to our advisory business or to our clients that we or any of our management persons have with any related person that is under common control and ownership, i.e., a(n):

- Investment company or other pooled investment vehicle (including a mutual fund, closed-end investment company, unit investment trust, private investment company or “hedge fund,” and offshore fund),
- Other investment adviser or financial planner,
- Futures commission merchant, or commodity pool operator or commodity trading advisor,
- Banking or thrift institution
- Accountant or accounting firm,
- Lawyer or law firm,
- Insurance company or agency,
- Pension consultant,
- Real estate broker or dealer, or
- Sponsor or syndicator of limited partnerships.

Third-Party Money Managers

We currently have no third-party money managers affiliated to our business or firm, nor fee-distribution agreement, or receive any kind of direct compensation for third-party referrals.

Code of Ethics Participation or Interest in Client Transactions and Personal Trading

Code of Ethics

We have adopted a written Code of Ethics in compliance with SEC Rule 204A-1 under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 (as amended — the Advisers Act). All of our employees are deemed to be supervised persons subject to our Code of Ethics. In carrying on our daily affairs, all of our supervised persons shall act in a fair, lawful and ethical manner, in accordance with the rules and regulations imposed by our governing regulatory authority. The Code of Ethics sets forth standards of conduct and requires compliance with federal securities laws. Our Code of Ethics also addresses personal trading and requires our personnel to report their personal securities holdings and transactions to our Chief Compliance Officer.

We have created a Code of Ethics which establishes standards and procedures for the detection and prevention of certain conflicts of interest, including activities by which persons having knowledge of the investments and our investment intentions might take advantage of that knowledge for their own benefit. We have in place Ethics Rules (the “Rules”), which are comprised of the Code of Ethics and Insider Trading policies and procedures. The Rules are designed to ensure that our personnel (i) observe applicable legal (including applicable state and federal securities laws) and ethical standards in the performance of their duties; (ii) at all times place your interests first; (iii) disclose all actual or potential conflicts; (iv) adhere to the highest standards of loyalty, candor and care in all matters relating to our clients; (v) conduct all personal trading consistent with the Rules and in such a manner as to avoid any actual or potential conflict of interest or any abuse of their position of trust and responsibility; and (vi) not use any material non- public information in securities trading. The Rules also establish policies regarding other matters such as outside employment, the giving or receiving of gifts, and safeguarding portfolio holdings information.

Under the general prohibitions of the Rules, our personnel may not: 1) effect securities transactions while in the possession of material, non-public information; 2) disclose such information to others; 3) participate

in fraudulent conduct involving securities held or to be acquired by any client; and 4) engage in frequent trading activities that create or may create a conflict of interest, limit their ability to perform their job duties, or violate any provision of the Rules.

In the event that you request a copy of our Code of Ethics, we will furnish to you a copy within a reasonable period of time at your current address of record. To request a copy, you can contact us at the address or telephone number on the cover page of this brochure, Attn: Chief Compliance Officer.

Personal Trading

Under the Code of Ethics, our personnel are required to conduct their personal investment activities in a manner that we believe is not detrimental to our advisory clients. Our personnel must conduct all personal trading in such a manner to avoid any actual or potential conflicts of interest or any abuse of their position of trust and responsibility. Our personnel are not permitted to engage in personal securities transactions except under circumstances specified in the Code of Ethics. The policy requires all supervised persons to report all personal transactions in securities not otherwise exempt under the policy. All reportable transactions are reviewed for compliance with the Code of Ethics. Reports of personal transactions in securities by our IARs are reviewed quarterly by our Chief Compliance Officer or his designee or more frequently if required.

We, or a related person, may buy, sell or hold securities we also recommend to clients, subject to the requirements of our internal policies and procedures. Our policies are based on the principle that we and our related person have a fiduciary duty to place the interests of clients ahead of their own interests. To the extent not prohibited by our policies, we and our related person may hold, acquire, increase, decrease or dispose of securities or other interests at or about the same time that we and our related person are purchasing or selling the same securities or interests for an advisory account.

We have created and implemented internal controls to monitor client accounts and proper allocation of investment opportunities, based on each client's stated investment objectives, to address these conflicts.

Participation or Interest in Client Transactions

As discretionary managers, we effect transactions for clients as deemed convenient and in accordance with client-specific strategies and investment objectives.

Brokerage Practices

Broker-Dealer/Custodian Recommendations

In selecting a broker-dealer and custodian for our client accounts, we will consider the value provided relative to expenses associated with trading and account maintenance fees, access to capital markets and financial products, additional brokerage products and services a broker-dealer has provided or will provide to us and our clients. We will recommend that clients establish brokerage accounts with Interactive Brokers Group LLC, a FINRA-registered broker-dealer and member of SIPC, to maintain custody of clients' assets. We do not receive any direct benefits or soft-dollar compensation from such broker-dealer.

Brokerage for Client Referrals

We do not consider, in selecting broker-dealers, whether we or a related person receives client referrals from the broker-dealer or third party.

Directed Brokerage

We do not have directed brokerage arrangements.

Trade Aggregation

We do not offer trade aggregations in any shape or form. Each account is individually managed and as such each trade specifically executed for each account holder.

Administrative Trade Errors

In the event that we make an error in submitting an investment or trade recommendation such as:

- The wrong security is bought or sold;
- A security is bought instead of sold;
- A transaction is executed for the wrong account,
- Securities are traded for a client that had a restriction on such security; or
- Securities are traded for the wrong accounts.

We may execute a correcting trade for the client account. If the investment results in a net profit from the corrective action, the gain will remain in your account and no further action will be taken. If a loss occurs due to our administrative trade error, we are responsible and will pay for the loss to ensure that you are made whole.

Note: To further avoid trade errors, it is requested that clients inform us of any modifications that could potentially alter their investment profile, client status, strategy and/or investment objectives.

Review of Accounts

Reviews and Reviewers of the Accounts

While client holdings and accounts are constantly monitored, formal reviews regarding your investment objectives and portfolio positioning—based on prevailing market conditions and established investment policies—will be conducted at least on an annual basis.

We may review client accounts more frequently than described above. Factors that can trigger an off-cycle review include major market or economic events, significant sector shifts, or direct requests by the client.

Nature and Frequency of Regular Reports Provided to Clients

You will receive monthly, or at least quarterly, statements of your account reflecting account values, positions, and activities, originating directly from your account custodian.

Client Referrals and Other Compensation

Client Referrals

We currently have no client referral arrangements.

Other Compensation

We do not receive an economic benefit, including sales awards or other prizes from a non-client for managing investment accounts, or providing any associated services to our clients.

Custody

We do not take physical possession of client funds or securities. Clients must credit or debit their investment accounts directly from an associated funding account held in matching names. You are also urged to carefully review and compare any reports you receive from our firm with the official account statements directly provided by your broker-dealer or custodian.

Investment Discretion

We operate with discretionary authority to manage securities accounts on your behalf. Specifically, we have discretionary authority to determine which securities to buy or sell on your behalf, determine the amount of securities to be bought or sold on your behalf, and may have authority as to what transaction fees shall be paid on your behalf depending on the nature of the transaction.

In managing your investment portfolio, we act in accordance with what we believe to be in your best interest. In executing buy and sell trades, we follow general guidelines established jointly with you, which may include instructions to refrain from trading certain securities or asset classes.

Any specific additional restrictions must be submitted to us in writing.

Voting Client Securities (i.e., Proxy Voting)

Proxy Voting

By default, discretionary management grants us the authority to vote proxies on your behalf unless explicitly stated otherwise. Our client advisory agreements, as well as other client documents, provide that our advisory clients expressly grant us the authority and responsibility for voting proxies of portfolio securities on their behalf.

Class Actions

From time-to-time securities held in your portfolio may be the subject of class action litigation. The decision regarding whether to file a proof of claim in a class action settlement is a question involving legal judgment. We do not instruct or give advice to you on whether or not to participate as a member of class action lawsuits and will not automatically file claims on your behalf. If you request additional assistance, we will provide any information pertaining to your securities that may be helpful and/or needed in order for you or your custodian to file a proof of claim in a class action.

Financial Information

We do not require or accept prepayments. We have no financial condition that is reasonably likely to impair our ability to meet contractual commitments to you. In addition, we are not currently, nor at any time in the past ten years been the subject of a bankruptcy petition.

Requirements for State-Registered Advisers

Each of our principal executive officers and management persons will provide their formal education and business background, including any business in which they are actively engaged (outside of giving investment advice) and the approximate amount of time spent on that business in a separate disclosure, the Form ADV Part 2B Supplement.

Our advisory services are provided through fee structures that offer in an isolated or combined fashion asset-based and performance-based compensation.

We do not, nor any of our management persons, have material facts regarding any legal, financial or other “disciplinary” item to report.

We do not, or any of our management persons, have any relationship or arrangement with any issuer of securities that is not listed in Item “Other Financial Industry Activities and Affiliations” of this Brochure.
